<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> 	<p>Sharing and taking turns with their peers. Become more outgoing regarding new social situations and unfamiliar people. Play in a group, extending and elaborating play idea, e.g. building up a role-play activity with other children.</p> 
<p>Physical Development</p> 	<p>Shows increased control when throwing and catching objects. Perseveres when developing independence by managing own personal hygiene e.g. changing into their P.E kit. Show some understanding of good practice related to healthy foods and exercise. Increased control when using particular equipment e.g. using scissors and holding a pencil correctly.</p>  
<p>Communication and Language</p> 	<p>Can recall and retell past events. Shows understanding of prepositions and can use them accurately. Shows increased confidence in expressing themselves during free flow group and whole class sessions and using more complex sentences.</p>  
<p>Mathematics</p> 	<p>Implement mathematical vocabulary accurately such as "same" and "different". For example, separates a group of three or four objects in different ways, beginning to recognise that the total is still the same. Counting beyond ten accurately. Using positional language in meaningful contexts and recognizing simple 2D shapes.</p>  
<p>Literacy - Reading</p> 	<p>Recognize familiar words such as own name and explore a range of songs and rhymes. Start to show some awareness of Rhyme. Start to explore a range of letters.</p> 
<p>Writing</p> 	<p>Talk about their own drawings, paintings and give meaning to marks they make more frequently and in greater detail. Keep on preserving when writing their own name and start to form recognizable letters.</p> 

<p>Understanding the World</p> 	<p>Talk about some of the things that make them unique, talk to friends about family and home. Talk about some things they may have observed such as plants and animals. Explore a range of electrical toys, ipad apps and age appropriate software.</p> 
<p>Expressive Arts and Design- Exploring and using media and materials</p> 	<p>Selects resources and constructs projects with a purpose in mind. Explain knowledge of a range of dancing, ring games and nursery rhymes.</p>  
<p>Expressive Arts and Design- Being Imaginative</p> 	<p>Use the role play and small world areas to interact and build up play with a group of children. Explore different types of musical instruments, follow beats and makes up rhythms.</p>
