<b>English reading and writing</b>	Imaginative story writing Poetry Instructions Describing contrasting pieces of music Poets Corner	<p><b>Reading</b></p> <p>Each child will read in school weekly and will bring a new reading book home. Please read with your child at home, little but often is the best option. Children to record a short comment in their reading diary and the pages they have read. In the reading diary you will find phonic sounds and words, please share a few of these with your child on a regular basis as this will support their learning. Share and read a variety of books both fiction and non-fiction especially those linked to current topics.</p> <p>Visit the library regularly, it's free!!!</p> <p>Talk about characters and settings, can you describe them?</p> <p>Predict what is going to happen in a story, can you make up a different ending?</p> <p>Read fluently using expression.</p> <p>Encourage reading of signs and notices when you are out and about.</p> <p>Point out digraphs (two letters one sound), trigraphs (three letters one sound) and tricky words whenever you come across them in print.</p> <p><b>English-Writing</b></p> <p>When writing take time to think of a sentence, say it to yourself, write it then read and check.</p> <p>Remember our Top Tip in Year 2- <b>Think it, Say it, Write it, Read it.</b></p> <p>Take pride in the presentation of your work, forming letters correctly.</p> <p>Always use capital letters and full stops.</p> <p>Embrace all opportunities to practise writing skills: shopping lists, Christmas lists, messages, interesting facts etc.</p> <p><b>Maths</b></p> <p>Ordering numbers, finding missing numbers, recognising number patterns</p> <p>Counting forwards and backwards in 2's, 5's and 10's</p> <p>Play shop at home using real coins and notes.</p> <p>Play dice games that involve addition and subtraction.</p> <p>Practise 2,5 and 10 times tables.</p> <p>Look at and have a go on- ICT games maths <a href="http://www.ictgames.com/resources.html">http://www.ictgames.com/resources.html</a></p> <p><b>Home Learning</b></p> <p>Home learning will be set on a Thursday and should be handed in the following Tuesday.</p>
